

The Humorous Sailing Glossary

Amidships - Condition of being surrounded by boats.

Chart – A nautical map often telling you exactly where you are aground.

Dead Reckoning - A course leading directly to a reef.

Deviation - Any departure from the Captain's orders.

Displacement - When you dock your boat and can't find it later.

Estimated Position - A place you have marked on the chart where you are sure you are not.
