## **Social Committee Restarts**

When Covid-19 struck in March of 2020, the LWYC was forced to curtail all activities. As the year progressed, the Board found ways to gradually resume some activities in a manner consistent with state and county health guidelines. In May we resumed our monthly membership meetings using the Zoom video platform. In mid-June, after careful consideration and study, we resumed a modified day sailing program with limited crew size, masking and social distancing requirements, and sanitizing of touchpoints before and after

each sail. In October we introduced the Mini Happy Hour – 10 or fewer people, outdoors, social distancing, and no sharing of food and drink (BYOE).

On January 18, 2021 we sent an email to our membership with a draft activity calendar for 2021 including aspirational dates for resumption of regular happy hours, in-person monthly meetings, larger crew sizes, destination sailing excursions, picnics, parties and more. We said, "While it is possible that the specific dates could change (sooner or later), we want our membership to know that we are committed to returning to normal as safely and as soon as possible."

We recently got some very good news from Orange County! If current trends continue, we will be entering the less-restrictive "Orange" tier of Covid-19 restrictions as soon as March 31! The Board has taken this as is a signal that it is time to restart the Social Committee! The Committee will begin meeting immediately to plan and implement our vision for a post-Covid Laguna Woods Yacht Club. There is light at the end of the tunnel! Stay tuned...

## Non-Hosted After Sail Happy Hours

The Mini Happy Hour concept has proven to be quite popular with our members. Soon we plan to experiment with a new concept - the Dockside Happy Hour (DHH). Several of our skippers routinely have happy hours after their sails in the picnic area of the marina. The DHH will be a "non-hosted" event (i.e., the skipper is not the host). DHHs will be posted for signup on LWYC web site and Wild Apricot app. The hours will be 4:00pm to 5:00pm and attendance will be limited to six people, or less. Participants will meet at a designated place in the marina area and find a picnic table or other location where chairs could be set up. There will be no guarantee that the skipper for that day will be back at any particular time, or that they or their crew would be able to participate in the DHH … but you never know. Hopefully this will be another way for our membership to stay in touch. Look for more information on the DHH coming out soon and stay in touch as COVID restrictions are eased.
