I grew up in Western Oregon where the nearest open water was the creek that flowed through a neighbor's pasture. My love of the water really began when I moved to Seattle after high school and thanks to an early work acquaintance discovered the wonders of the waters of Puget Sound. I actually built a 16' plywood hull runabout thinking that I wanted to become a salmon fisherman. During one early fishing expedition off Bainbridge Island, our fishing was interrupted by a large local pod of Orcas swimming through the fishing grounds, and while the rest of the fishing fleet pulled up their gear and they left in disgust since the fishing was ruined by the Orcas, I was enthralled about being able to share the waters with the Orcas.

For a few years, work duties reduced my ability to get on the water as much as I wanted. I was enthused about learning to sail since I envisioned a future living on the water. Finally, when my wife Noemi and I were in our mid-50s, we purchased a 1/3 partnership in a 34' Hunter. What sealed the deal for the purchase was a promise by the other partners that they would teach us to sail! The partnership was a great success, since only three years later we sold our five-bedroom house and put the equity into a beautiful 45' Freedom - Center Cockpit Sloop (Tatiana) and moved onto the boat. We did come to our senses after a couple years of living aboard in Seattle winters and purchased a condo in downtown Seattle. We were both still working in responsible positions, so we had to wait a few years to really enjoy the sailing life, but eventually we spent summers anchored out in the numerous coves of the San Juan Islands and Canadian Gulf Islands. Our greatest adventure was rounding Vancouver Island in 2004 and taking part in the NorPac Race off the West coast of Vancouver Island.

We sold Tatiana in 2008 and shortly thereafter discovered Laguna Woods. One of the main reasons we moved here was the existence of LWYC. I've been sailing with LWYC since 2010 and my current schedule is sailing on Saturdays and during Full Moon Sails.
